Yesterday we held a Zoom meeting with families to discuss extending the visitation restrictions at the Care Centre. Together we decided to extend the “no visitation” for all designated family/support persons to January 14, 2021. A designated family/support person may be a family member, friend, companion, support worker, power of attorney/trustee, agent, legal guardian, or any other person identified by the resident or alternate decision maker. We appreciate the support of everyone in helping to slow the spread of the virus.

Exceptions will be made for any resident who is considered to be at end-of-life. Should this occur, designated family/support person visitation will be coordinated through the Clinical Leads.

We will be continuing our virtual visits for families.

This discontinuation of visitation will be re-evaluated in 14 days through a family Zoom meeting. Details on this will be sent out closer to the date.

We thank you for your patience, support and understanding during this challenging time.
